Financial Year Results



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Key Performance Indicators

The data for this report is sourced from the National Visitor Survey produced by Tourism Research Australia, based on data for the 2020-21 financial year. According to TRA, across **all of Australia**, the number of domestic overnight trips in regional areas decreased 12% in the year-end June 2021.¹ The results for Port Stephens, however, show a 20% increase on the previous year for domestic overnight visitors, and a 2% increase on all visitors. As shown on page 3 this result was supported by a strong performing final quarter in Apr- June 2021.

Visitor Expenditure

In year ending June 2021, total visitor expenditure to Port Stephens was \$705 million, an increase of 24% on the previous year.

Domestic Source Markets

Domestic source markets remain in a similar pattern to previous years, with day visitors from the Hunter providing the majority of day visitors, while Sydney is still the main overnight visitor market.

When 2020/21 is compared to the five year average, there was a slight variation in the overnight market with an increase in visitors coming from Sydney (+11%) than in the previous five years, and less from the Hunter and other areas of NSW. The day visitor market showed no significant change in source markets.

Domestic Overnight Visitors

Travel Party

The travel party of domestic overnight visitors has not changed significantly over the past 5 years, with slight variations of 1-3% seen in some segments. Friends/relatives travelling in a group with or without children remain the largest segment at 32%, along with adult couples at 31%.

Reason to travel to the destination

There has been a shift from VFR to holiday visitors, with 7% more holiday visitors in 2021 than the 5 year average, and correspondingly a 6% decrease in VFR travellers. As shown, the VFR market was lower than the previous 4 years.

Age and gender

The age of domestic overnight visitors has not changed significantly over the past 5 years, with only slight variations of 1-3% seen in some age segments.

There was also no change to the gender split of visitors at a steady 50% male and 50% female.


Quarterly analysis

When comparing the quarterly analysis on the previous year, the impacts of Covid-19 travel restrictions on both overnight and day visitors can be observed. In the June 2020 quarter regional travel restrictions in NSW were in place, while in 2021 there were less restrictions, resulting in strong gains of 99% in the June quarter from 2020.
